## **FOREWORD**

2018 was a historic year for the Camden Climate Change Alliance as it celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Since its launch, over 380 businesses have accessed the support that helps members realise their sustainability objectives. With growing awareness and concern about climate change and other sustainability issues, such as air quality and the need to reduce the amount of waste we produce, particularly single-use plastics, efforts to empower and connect organisations in the borough to deliver sustainable services and products are more important than ever.

The Camden Climate Change Alliance aims to create positive and constructive connections between businesses, third sector organisations and schools in Camden. Connections help to mobilise skills, knowledge and resources across organisations so that they are better equipped to help drive environmental improvement.

I am very pleased to see that the work of the Alliance in 2018 has placed particular emphasis on strengthening partnerships and collaborative work. This includes collaborating with the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy and the Knowledge Quarter in engaging local businesses with the first-ever Green Great Britain Week and delivering a borough-wide campaign with the Cross River Partnership and CCCA members on Clean Air Day. I'm looking forward to seeing more progress across the Camden Climate Change Alliance membership over 2019 as we all find new pioneering ways to improve our local environment.

## BOARD'S INTRODUCTION

2018 saw continued success on carbon emission reduction with 89% of Camden Climate Change Alliance members who reported their energy data reducing their carbon emissions compared to the previous year. The average carbon emissions reduction of all those who reported was 19%. This contributes towards the 40% borough-wide reduction in carbon emissions.

Working in partnership has been a focus in the last year as we continued to expand the range of support to address wider sustainability challenges. These include air quality and waste reduction that have become top priorities not only for business but for third sector organisations and schools across the borough. Going forward we are developing new strategies to expand our reach while contributing to tackling

borough priorities. We are doing this by enhancing our online information platform and piloting new approaches that enable us to deliver effective and efficient support to schools and the third sector, including our new Corporate Social Responsibility matching service and sponsorship initiative.

I would like to thank all members for the ongoing support and encourage anyone who might have an innovative idea of how we can work together to address air quality, waste and carbon reduction to get in contact with us.

Established in 2008, the Camden Climate Change Alliance (CCCA) is a sustainability network and specialised consultancy, working in partnership with key organisations, businesses and schools to enable them to fulfil their sustainability potential. We do this by:

Our sustainability experts work in collaboration with other local networks including Business Improvement Districts (Camden Town Unlimited, BEE London, Euston Town, Fitzrovia Partnership and Hatton Garden), the Knowledge Quarter and business forums such as King's Cross Estate Environment Forum and Urban Partners for King's Cross, Euston and St Pancras.

The CCCA is overseen by an Advisory Board comprising member organisations. The Advisory Board ensures that the needs of the business community are met, while setting the strategic direction of the CCCA.

#### Our membership

The CCCA network brings together businesses ranging from micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) to very large organisations. It spans a variety of sectors from professional services to entertainment with over 270 members across Camden.

The CCCA has two levels of membership – Basic and Premium. Basic membership provides free access to services including the online 'Made Easy' guides, workshops, electronic updates and our local Carbon Certification scheme. We provide free environmental assessments to new members with advice on where to make improvements to their premises, policies and practices.



#### Consultancy

We offer a variety of specialised sustainability consultancy services to support organisations and schools on their sustainability path. These include:

The CCCA's free Carbon Certification scheme recognises the progress made by our members to reduce their carbon footprint and contribute to Camden's overall aim of reducing the borough's emissions by 40% by 2020. There are three certification levels: Going Green, Cutting Carbon and Carbon Champion. An additional Team Green engagement certification is also available.

The pilot phase of the Camden Climate Fund, a Camden Council initiative, saw a number of businesses each provided with up to £5,000 to improve the energy efficiency of their buildings. The CCCA provides support in the form of a site visit, tools and information to assist members with their application.

## **OUR IMPACT**

#### **Carbon Footprint**

Members are encouraged to report direct emissions from the use of heating and fuels in facilities and other assets, including company-owned vehicles (scope 1), as well as electricity consumption (scope 2). This provides two benefits:

- Annual reporting acts as a catalyst for organisations to become accountable for their emissions, which leads to actions to reduce them.
- The CCCA is able to identify trends and challenges that organisations face in managing emissions.
