FOREWORD

2019 saw the climate crisis become the issue of our age, and the 2020s are already shaping up to be the defining decade for climate action. Now like never before, people are demanding that businesses and organisations change the way they operate in response to the climate crisis. As a Council, we know we need to respond to the growing environmental concerns of our community and have worked hard to cut our carbon emissions by 44% across our own estate and operations since 2010. Across the Camden Climate Change Alliance there has also been incredible progress, with carbon emissions across Camden now 39% below 2005 levels, but we know that we all need to go further and faster.

With over 400 organisations joining the network since its formation, the Camden Climate Change Alliance offers support that makes a real difference. The CCCA can help your business, organisation or school reduce waste, improve local air quality, or access funding for energy efficiency improvements and renewable energy systems. It also provides a platform for you to share successes and raise your profile as an environmentally responsible Camden based institution.

The Climate Change Alliance is also about connections and I am pleased that 2019 has seen businesses, third sector organisations and schools in Camden come together to work on environmental solutions. The 'Sustainers' project joined up school projects with businesses through our Dragon's Den funding event, and the 'Camden Recycles Cups' project is working with Hubbub and Veolia to cut waste across three Business Improvement Districts. On air quality, the CCCA is working with Business Improvement Districts and organisations such as Cross River Partnership to reduce the number of deliveries. Our 2019 Sustainability Awards at the Jerwood Hall was a great way to celebrate these successes – you can read more about the inspirational award winners later in this report.

I would like to thank all members for your committed work to date and for helping to make the Camden Climate Change Alliance stronger. The coming year brings with it new opportunities and expectations about how we react to the growing climate emergency – the CCCA is here to help. Thank you for being part of the network.

In 2019 Camden Climate Change Alliance members continued to reduce their carbon emissions by an average of 20%. This has contributed to the 45% reduction in carbon emissions that we've seen across the commercial and industrial sector in Camden since 2008.

In light of the climate crisis there is an ever-increasing recognition by businesses that operating sustainably must be a business as usual activity. As was seen at the recent Sustainability Awards, many are doing this already in Camden and indeed many are going further than ever before in considering their wide-ranging impact not only on the environment but also on the local community.



Carbon Certification

The CCCA's free Carbon Certification scheme recognises the progress made by our members to reduce their carbon footprint and contribute to Camden's zero carbon ambitions. There are three certification levels: Going Green, Cutting Carbon and Carbon Champion. We also offer Team Green certification that recognises environmental action by staff within organisations.

EVENTS AND COLLABORATION

During 2019, the CCCA continued to deliver and support a range of projects and activities that secured environmental benefit and built connections across the CCCA membership.



- 1 Camden Council held the UK's first Citizens' Assembly on the climate crisis, to shape a new Climate Action Plan for Camden. The CCCA hosted a roundtable event for members who wanted to contribute climate proposals to the Assembly.
- 2 Funded by Defra's Clean Air Grant, the CCCA is working with Cross River Partnership to deliver freight delivery consolidation across three Business Improvement Districts using Camden Council's Freight Consolidation Centre.
- 3 The Sustainable Development Goal leaders group seeks to simplify the SDGs for businesses, communities and schools to demonstrate the impact local action has on global issues.

- 4 Funded by Hubbub's Cup Fund, the CCCA is working with Veolia and Business Improvement Districts to encourage the reduction of single-use cups and improve recycling. #InTheLoop.
- 5 Working with schools across the borough to drive forward sustainability projects supported by CCCA members. Special thanks to Troup Bywaters and Anders, Alara and Friends House.
- 6 Funded by the Mayor of London's Air Quality Fund the Camden Town Low Emission Neighbourhood improves local air quality through a number of measures targeted to reduce emissions from transport and buildings.

OUR IMPACT

Carbon Footprint

Members are encouraged to report direct emissions from heating and use of fuel in facilities and assets, such as vehicles, that the company owns (scope 1), and electricity consumption (scope 2). This provides two benefits:

- Annual reporting acts as a catalyst for organisations to become accountable for their emissions, which leads to actions to reduce them.
- The CCCA is able to identify trends and challenges that organisations face in managing emissions.

Carbon Certification

Members who report are eligible to take part in our Carbon Certification scheme. In 2019, **44 members** were awarded a carbon credential and another three the Team Green award.
