2024 - A SNAPSHOT

The Camden Climate Alliance (CCA) is a sustainability network established in 2008 comprised of businesses, community organisations and schools working to tackle the climate crisis.

The CCA now has over 500 members and supports organisations by facilitating knowledge transfer, fostering collaboration, and providing funding to help organisations in Camden reduce their emissions and build resilience to a changing climate.

In 2024 the Camden Climate Alliance focused on delivering:

- Energy efficiency advice and support through the Camden and Brent Business Climate Challenge
- Training opportunities to upskill businesses on reducing energy use
- Connections between businesses and community climate action projects
- Youth development opportunities through our Climate Connectors programme

In 2024, we successfully delivered the Camden and Brent Business Climate Challenge, which supported 86 businesses across Camden, Brent and Westminster to provide tailored energy efficiency advice including:

- An energy audit
- A recommendation report
- Access to an interactive energy management dashboard

As part of the programme, the CCA delivered a series of training sessions to support businesses to reduce their energy consumption.

The Climate Connectors programme continued for a third consecutive year in 2024, mobilising climate action projects in communities and schools with the backing of local businesses.

Looking ahead to 2025, we will be concluding the Camden and Brent Business Climate Challenge and engaging with businesses to help shape Camden Council's next Climate Action Plan.

The third phase of the Climate Connectors programme was delivered in partnership with Think & Do and London Clean Air, supporting:

- 41 climate action projects
- £98,237 in value generated
- 1,382 hours volunteered
- £5,900 donated by businesses to support local greening and climate action projects in schools




Through the Camden and Brent
Business Climate Challenge we
delivered four training sessions
attended by 39 Camden businesses
to help businesses gain skills to
reduce their energy consumption,
reduce operational costs and cut
carbon. Topics covered included
Carbon Literacy, Energy Management
and Behaviour change.

10 Camden Businesses are now certified as carbon literate.

Through the Camden and Brent Business
Climate Challenge we delivered 80 energy audit and recommendation reports to businesses across Camden, Brent and Westminster.

37 of these were delivered to businesses based in Camden.



The Camden Climate Fund awarded £20,000 in grant funding to support businesses to install energy efficiency technologies such as LED lighting and Solar PV.

The Camden Climate Alliance hosted two Sustainability Roundtables in collaboration with Start Up Discovery school to workshop practical actions for organisations to contribute to Camden Council's next Climate Action Plan.





BUSINESS HIGHLIGHTS


Camden businesses have supported the Communi-trees programme, with organisations including Savills, Troup Bywaters + Anders, BeOffices, Loud Mobility and Revcap helping to plant community orchard across two estates in Kilburn.



At the end of 2024, 21 Camden Businesses in the Camden and Brent Business Climate Challenge have agreed to implement energy efficiency improvements including LED lighting upgrades, secondary glazing and temperature optimisation.

The Business Beeline was a Camden Town Unlimited project delivered with Think and Do and London Clean Air in early summer 2024. Supported by Camden Climate Alliance volunteers, it engaged 21 businesses over six months and installed 23 planters with over 200 plants along Drummond Street, creating a new green corridor.






The British Library launched their

Sustainability and Climate Change

Strategy. The strategy focuses on ongoing efforts to decarbonise buildings, alongside collaboration with stakeholders to develop new approaches to environmental challenges and embed sustainability.



SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS



Regent High and Parliament Hill school installed 90.3kWp Solar PV array on the school buildings, expecting to save over 15 tonnes of CO₂ a year. The installation was supported by £50,000 grant from the Camden Climate Fund Community Energy grant.

We supported the Sustainability Careers Fair at Earthfest to help promote careers in sustainability. Several CCA members attended including the Wesley Hotel, Troup Bywaters + Anders, Sheppard Robson and the British Library.





We hosted our second Dragons Den event in March 2024, enabling students from 12 primary schools to pitch their sustainability projects for funding. **A total of £5,900 was donated by businesses** to support the projects, including contributions from TB&A, Anthesis + Revolt London, Sheppard Robson, Phoenix Court, and CBRE UK.
